



Your support is critical to our success.








**Student Demographics**

# LOOKING **AHEAD**

2022-2023

CIS of Atlanta will serve more than 46,000 K-12 students, at 64 Metro Atlanta schools.

With the achievement of Vision 2021's primary target - 95% promotion/graduation -CIS of Atlanta moves onto our newest 5 year strategic plan. Vision 2026, CIS of Atlanta's comprehensive strategic plan, focuses on growing our programmatic footprint by continuing to provide critical dropout prevention services to more K-12 students and families, as well as expanding into post-secondary/alumni services

### The primary goal is that by 2026

95% of case-managed students will be promoted or will graduate, and at least 85% of alumni persist through college.

### Five Priority Outcomes Include:

- Secure Basic Needs: 90% of case-managed students receiving emergency assistance remain in school.
- Social Emotional Wellness & Positive School Engagement: 75% of case-managed students with moderate re-engagement level
- School Attendance: 90% overall average attendance rate of case-managed students.
- **Graduation & Promotion:** 95% graduation and promotion of case-managed students.
- Post-High School Success: 85% of alumni persist through college.
