

# Student Demographics by Race & Gender



# VISION<sub>26</sub>

With the achievement of Vision 2021's primary target - 95% promotion/graduation - CIS of Atlanta moves onto our newest 5 year strategic plan. Vision 2026, CIS of Atlanta's comprehensive strategic plan, focuses on growing our programmatic footprint by continuing to provide critical dropout prevention services to more K-12 students and families, as well as expanding into post-secondary/alumni services.

#### The primary goal is that by 2026

95% of case-managed students will be promoted or will graduate, and at least 85% of alumni persist through college.

#### Five Priority Outcomes Include:

- > Secure Basic Needs: 90% of case-managed students receiving emergency assistance remain in school.
- Social Emotional Wellness & Positive School Engagement: 75% of case-managed students with moderate re-engagement level.
- School Attendance: 90% overall average attendance rate of case-managed students.
- Graduation & Promotion: 95% graduation and promotion of case-managed students.
- Post-High School Success: 85% of alumni persist through college.

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
